## Sustainable Community Development in Tanzania

What is development? This six week study abroad program in northern Tanzania focuses on the study and practice of development in a Tanzanian context. Students will learn about the history of development in Tanzania, various approaches to development work, and MSU's current development initiatives in Tanzania. Students will have a chance to apply what they learn in the classroom through a hands-on community engagement program in a Tanzanian village, in partnership with local community members, and faculty and students from the University of Dar es Salaam. Together teams will address pressing development need within the village. Still accepting applications for the Summer of 2013, however, the program will also be offered Summer of 2014.
