

Presented by Dr. Edith Sarra and Dr. Yasuko Ito Watt, Indiana University, this event is a presentation of a sequence of fifty tanka (short poems) written by poet and schoolteacher Tanaka Takuya (b. 1971). Intended to document "as directly as possible" an experience of the Great East Japan Earthquake in Mito, Ibaraki prefecture, the sequence chronicles fifteen hours, from Friday afternoon, March 11, 2011, to sunrise Saturday, March 12, 2011. Study Abroad in Tanzania: Sustainable Community Development

This is a highly subsidized interdisciplinary study program that focuses on the study and practice of development. Students will learn about the history of development in Tanzania, various approaches to development work, and MSU's current development strategies in Tanzania. Students will have a chance to apply what they learn in the classroom through a hands-on community engagement program in a Tanzanian village, partnering with Tanzanian students from the University of Dar es Salaam. Study Abroad in Greece and Turkey: Contemporary Culture, Politics, and Society

This interdisciplinary program offers students the opportunity to earn credit through the College of Social Science, including specialized field research, while experiencing Greek, Turkish, and Eastern Mediterranean culture, politics, economy, society, and traditions. Students can take Sociology and ISS classes and will also be exposed to techniques of participant observation as a research field method. Festivals, rituals, family, household, village, and city customs and practices are all valuable mechanisms for learning the social economic, cultural, political, and religious activities and traditions that make a society definable, distinctive, and durable. Students will also explore and understand the causes, content, and consequences of the current economic crisis and associated social turmoil in Greece.
