DIVERSITY AND GLOBAL CHANGE INTERNSHIP Application Deadline: Monday, April 4

MSU's Center for Gender in Global Context is seeking two interns for its Gender, Development, and Globalization (GDG) Program for Fall Semester 2011.

This is a paid position requiring a commitment of 10-20 hours per week. Applicants must be enrolled at Michigan State University and should be **sophomores or juniors** by Fall Semester 2011. Excellent writing and research skills are required. Also necessary are computer knowledge, an ability to work

independently, and a strong interest in issues of diversity and women's issues on an international and global level. Web abilities are preferable but not required.

The internship involves working on GenCen's website, the *Gendered Perspectives on International Development Resource Bulletin*, and other projects. In addition, each intern is assigned a special project of his/her own, identified in collaboration with the Co-Directors. Depending on performance, the position may continue through Spring Semester 2012.

This is an excellent opportunity for students of International Relations, Public Policy, Political Science, Anthropology, Sociology, Geography, or anyone interested in development and globalization issues and their effects on women.
